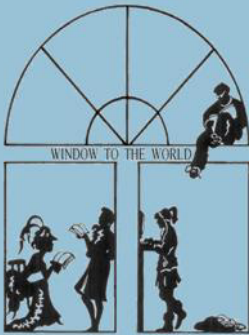

Author Visit: Kim Edwards

The Friends of Paul Sawyer Public Library are pleased to bring acclaimed novelist Kim Edwards to Frankfort to read from her new release, *The Lake of Dreams*, on Tuesday evening, May 17th at 6:00pm. A book signing will follow with copies of her



works available for purchase from Poor Richard's Books.

This event is free to the public and will take place in the First United Methodist Church Wesley Center located at 211 Washington Street.

As a special incentive courtesy of the Friends, the first 50 attendees to this event will receive a free copy of *The Lake of Dreams*!

Edwards' first novel, *The Memory Keeper's Daughter*, spent 122 weeks on the New York Times Best Seller List, 20 of those weeks at #1. In addition to being published in 38 countries,

it also won the Kentucky Literary Award, the British Book Award, and was chosen as Book of the Year in 2006 by *USA Today*. Edwards is also the author of *The Secrets of a Fire King*, a finalist for the PEN/Hemingway award.

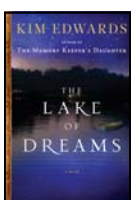

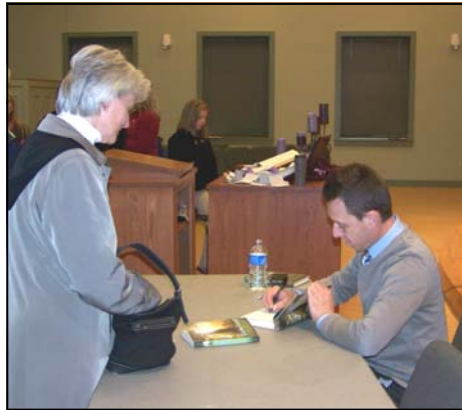

Fun Fact! Paul Sawyer Public Library Trivia

When the library first opened in 1906, managed by the Woman's Club of Frankfort, it was only open to the public one day a week, and patrons were charged \$1 per year for a library card. Now we are open 7 days a week (64 hours per week), and a library card is completely free and available to all ages.
