Prevent the Summer Slide

Many children and teens experience something called the "summer slide," meaning they forget some of what they've learned during the school year, sometimes as much as 30%.

Libraries and the Summer Reading Program play a huge role in helping to prevent this summer slide by keeping kids reading and learning throughout the summer.

Here are some ways you can help prevent the summer slide:

Encourage children to read every day, maybe a magazine or even a recipe in the morning, a book in the afternoon or evening. Also, let kids pick out the books they want to read! Children will gain more from summer reading if they are enjoying it.

Keep reading aloud to children and teens (yes, even teens benefit!). This builds listening comprehension skills and increases their success when they read on their own.

Need help picking out books with your child or teen? Please ask at the Youth Services Desk! From easy readers like *Elephant and Piggie* to getting started in chapter books (*Magic Treehouse*, anyone?) to young adult books, we can help you find a good book!




